

May you encounter our living God afresh as we walk through the scriptures, through the lens of changing seasons, learning lessons we can use as tools to equip us for a life of victory here in the land of the living. Part 1 focusses on identifying which season you are in.

Seasons from God have purpose

The different seasons we see in our lives, as in nature, are anchored in God's sovereign purpose.

It is God alone that changes our appointed season, in line with His great loving plan (His will).

'He made the moon to mark the seasons, and the sun knows when to go down.' Psalms 104: 19

'...Let us fear the Lord our God, who gives autumn and spring rains in season, who assures us of the regular weeks of harvest.' Jeremiah 5: 24

'Even the stork in the sky knows her appointed seasons, and the dove, the swift and the thrush observe the time of their migration. But my people do not know the requirements of the Lord.' Jeremiah 8: 7

'Praise be to the name of God for ever and ever; wisdom and power are his. He changes times and seasons; he deposes kings and raises up others. He give wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the discerning.' Daniel 2: 20,21



Blessings and troubles have their seasons

Through our lives, we all face a unique combination of exterior factors in our lives contributing to our experiences of blessings or trouble, fear or peace. God's purpose for your life still remains central.

'There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens' Ecclesiastes 3:1

'That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither – whatever they do prospers.' Psalm 1:3

'I will make them and the place surrounding my hill a blessing. I will send down showers in season; there will be showers of blessing.' Ezekiel 34: 26

'Yet he has not left himself without testimony: He has shown kindness by giving you rain from heaven and crops in their seasons: he provides you with plenty of food and fills your hearts with joy.' Acts 14: 17



Significance of Seasons

To make the most of the opportunity/ies different seasons present, our actions need to be correct. In turn, our actions need to be in support of what God is seeking to do in our lives.

'Seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to find out if it had any fruit. When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs.' Mark 11: 13

'Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage – with great patience and careful instruction.' 2 Timothy 4: 2

'... - in the hope of eternal life, which God, who does not lie, promised before the beginning of time, and which now at his appointed season he has brought to light through the preaching entrusted to me by the command of God our Saviour,...' Titus 1: 2.3

Examining our season in relation to God

We need to carefully examine what our role is in our season while trusting God for the rest. God has a specific will for our lives and we need to think critically about where on life's journey we are. Let us not miss opportunities to achieve our purpose in God.

My Actions:

Us in relation to God:

- God's sovereign purposes are central to your life and we need to seek God's heart first
- Your personal season, at an appointed time, is anchored around God's will for your life
- Our world that we live in presents blessings, fears, troubles and peace – a collective experience, driven by many factors
- God ordained opportunity and season may still have many options – the enemy will want to draw you away from God's purpose in your season

God's work

Biblical pattern of events always points to Jesus:

- God's power revealed (Summer): creation story in old testament, miracles of Jesus in new testament
- God tests / World rebels (Autumn): tower of Babylon in old testament, pharisees questioning in new testament
- Jesus crucified (Winter): Moses died before reaching promised land, darkness of crucifixion
- Jesus resurrection (Spring): Isaac saved from being a sacrifice, Jesus resurrection paid our price

Reflection: Where are you at?

On the next page, place a **heart** at the place you believe you are at currently?

- Are you experiencing a time of Trouble or a season of Blessing?
 - A time of trouble (tribulation) may be caused by loss, marriage trouble, sickness, financial loss, work challenges – really anything that causes you to have a sense of loss, even lost identity
 - A season of blessing may be a new relationship, birth of a child, financial blessings – anything which causes a sense of joy, even simple joy of being alive
- Would you say the majority of your time is spent with a sense of peace or is fear pre-occupying your mind and actions?
 - We are at peace when there is a sense of movement and progress in our lives. Think of a river running over rocks being hemmed in by riverbanks – it is not stagnant, it is also not rough like an ocean. It's a steadfast sense of hope. A state of shalom or wholeness – your whole being is well – mind, body and soul.
 - Fear can be subtle or very obvious. It can be recognized through a sense of anxiety, overwhelmed, paralysis or disconnectedness. It's a hopelessness or awareness that all is not well. Fear in itself is not bad but our reaction to it which matters.

Wherever you find yourself, know that God is already there, waiting for you... to remind you again of His unconditional, everlasting love for you.

Meditate on the Bible chapter Romans 8

"...we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience;

And patience, experience; and experience, hope: And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy [Spirit] which is given unto us." Romans 5: 3-5

"For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 8: 38, 39

 - Bragging and arrogance, i.e. forgetting we are all undeserving and our best efforts are as rags before God
 - Distractions
 - Stress and Busy-ness

 - Negative attitudes, addictions and people

Autumn: peace with trouble looming

My actions God's work

Preparation, acceptance of tough times at hand/ Pruning or cutting back to focus resources Leaves changing colour / Changing circumstances / removing our comforts

- What I should do:
 - Let go of what the summer season no longer offers
 - Deal with emotions of loss and grieving
 - Be sensitive to those in spring seasons
 - Pro-actively prepare for time of trouble, i.e. seek help, free up finances and/or time
 - Manage expectations of others around you that some things may be changing
- What I should avoid:
 - Seeing every part of your life as troubled
 - Withdrawing from the love of God and people – isolation
 - Unhealthy crutches / dependencies in people or substances as coping mechanisms

- 'Be glad, people of Zion, rejoice in the LORD your God, for he has given you the autumn rains in righteousness. He sends you abundant showers, both autumn and spring rains, as before.' Joel 2:23
- 'When they walk through the Valley of Weeping, it will become a place of refreshing springs. The autumn rains will clothe it with blessings.' Psalm 84:6
- 'They do not say in their hearts, 'Let us fear the Lord our God, who gives the rain in its season, the autumn rain and the spring rain, and keeps for us the weeks appointed for the harvest.' Jeremiah 5:24

Spring: from fear to blessings

My actions

Preparation for good times / Readiness of anticipation / Expectant and pregnant with hope

God's work

Bringing young shoots from seed / New beginnings unfolding / A change for good

- What I should do:
 - Learn to discern when blessings are near, it prepares you to know when the kingdom of God is near
 - Ask for our blessings and press into God's truth and character – His goodness
 - Ready ourselves: clean hearts, confessing our sins, "spring cleaning" our lives, prepare the soil, pull out weeds
 - Be sensitive to those in Autumn seasons
- What I should avoid
 - Being impatient and "creating" our own blessing which is not from God
 - Expecting the world to believe with you or to see through your faith lens

- Look at the fig tree and all the trees. When they sprout leaves, you can see for yourselves and know that summer is near. Even so, when you see these things happening, you know that the kingdom of God is near.' Luke 21:29-31
- 'Ask the LORD for rain in the springtime;'
 Zechariah 10:1 'Let us acknowledge the
 LORD; let us press on to acknowledge him.
 As surely as the sun rises, he will appear; he
 will come to us ... like the spring rains that
 water the earth.' Hosea 6:3
- *Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring **rains**.' James 5:7


Every evening sky, an invitation






How best should you be responding in a long winter or long summer?

Meditation


- ¹I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman.
- ² Every branch in me that beareth not fruit he taketh away: and every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit.
- ³ Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you.
- ⁴ Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me.
- ⁵I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.
- ⁶ If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast them into the fire, and they are burned.
- ⁷ If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.
- ⁸ Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.
- ⁹ As the Father hath loved me, so have I loved you: continue ye in my love.
- ¹⁰ If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments, and abide in his love.
- ¹¹ These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full.
